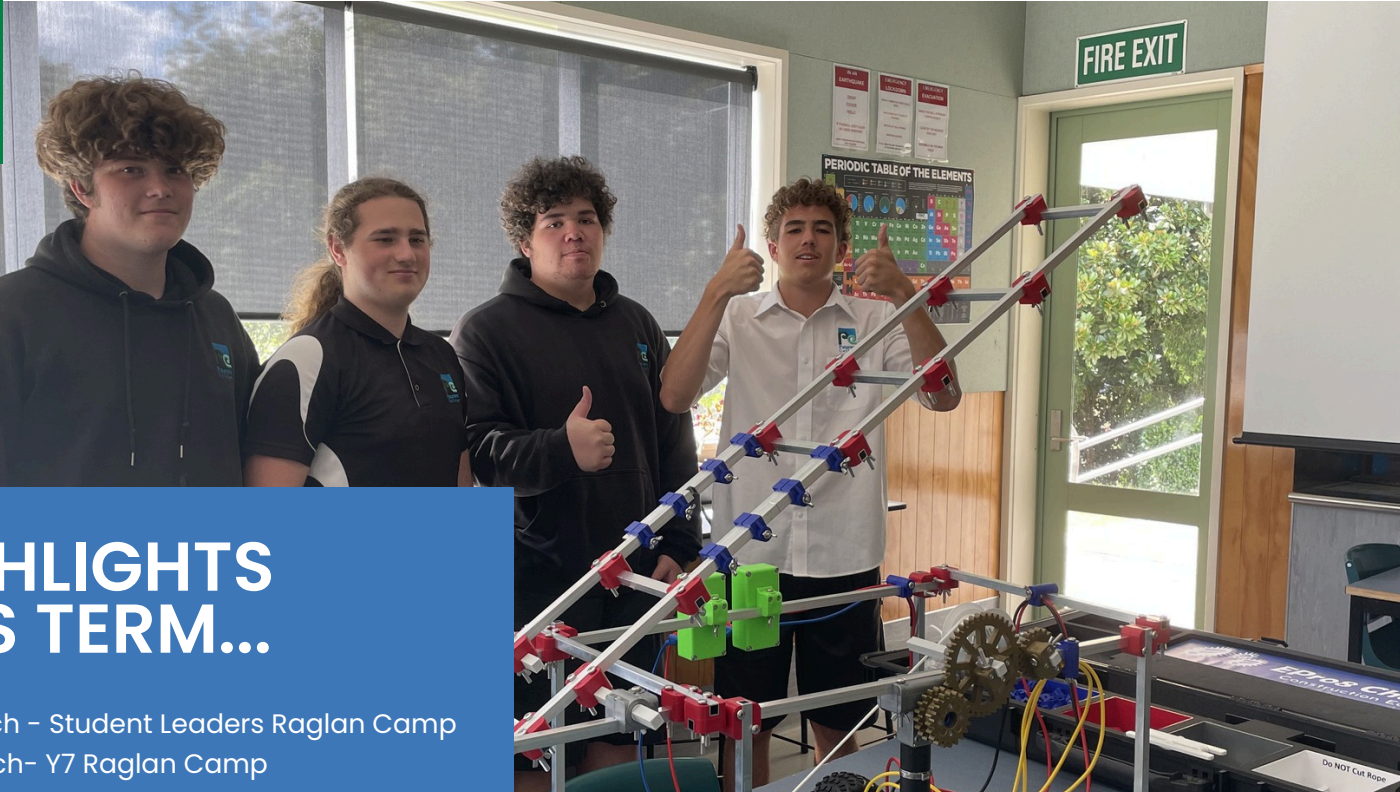

The Morning Re-Set

A calm, on-time start to the morning sets the tone for a successful day of learning. It ensures fairness for everyone, as valuable learning time is protected and disruptions are minimised. Morning whānau time is mandatory and an important start to the school day, providing an opportunity to reflect, set goals, and identify any extra support that may be needed.

How it works: Students who arrive after the 8:45 AM (or 9:30AM for Tuesdays) bell will be recorded as late at the front office. At the start of Interval that day, those students will be required to attend a 'reset' in the School Hall.

The goal of this session is twofold:

Accountability: To give back the time missed during morning learning.

Support: To identify if there are barriers at home that we can help with.

For students who are frequently late, we will be using a reflection process to understand the "why" and work with you to find a solution.

Being on time, in correct uniform, and ready to learn is key to student success, helping to build positive habits and strong routines that support positive outcomes for all.
